Astrology's Good Buzz Continues

In my most recent Astrology News column for TMA (Feb./March 2018), I wrote about the upswing of astrologically themed features and discussions currently taking a top spot in the media. The beat goes on. Starting the new year, The New York Times (January 1, 2018) featured an article about why astrology is "suddenly trendy" again: "How Astrology Took Over the Internet," by Amanda Hess. In the wake of numerous feature articles, blogs, newsgroups, and other posts, astrology continues to be a hot topic, particularly among the millennial generation. Hess points out that one primary reason astrology is popular is that it is tailored to the individual. Even the limitations imposed by referring to information about Sun signs can offer acknowledgment of the personal audience. Hess reviews several new apps and websites. One app she describes as "re-branding the Zodiac for the digital set." She further emphasizes the fact that the new Internet content requires full birth data, adding truly personal details to be mined by the algorithms being utilized. Ultimately, she states, the information becomes almost too detailed, especially when it includes a lot of astrological terms that leave the reader feeling intimidated and uncertain.

On air, NPR's *On Point* radio broadcast of January 19, 2018 was centered upon the growing interest in astrology by the millennials. This program is available as a podcast on NPR.org (http://www. wbur.org/onpoint/2018/01/18/formillennials-astrology-is-on-the-rise). Additionally, *The Atlantic* (January 16, 2018) highlights the same topic in an article by Julie Beck, "The New Age of Astrology." Beck states, "Astrology is a meme, and it's spreading in the blooming, unfurling way that memes do." (Beck is one of the guests featured on the NPR program.) In her article, she cites Los Angeles astrologer Chani Nicholas: "Then there's something that's happened in the last five years that's given [astrology] an edginess, a relevance for this time and place, that it hasn't had for a good 35 years. Millennials have taken it and run with it." Beck's exploration of the subject is extensive, with interviews of people who use astrology in its many forms today, practitioners of astrology, academicians, and others regarding the whys and wherefores of astrology's current favorability. She notes that it's not so much a belief system as it is another way of looking at life. She also quotes Nicholas Campion, astrological historian, who points out that even those who don't "believe" in astrology may identify with what their zodiac sign indicates about their personality, and might also read their horoscopes. Other periodicals have featured astrology-based articles that might never have seen the light of day in the past. For example, *Allure* magazine (January 18, 2018) offered an excellent article by Aliza Kelly Faragher, "Saturn Is Now in Capricorn, and It Could Be a Major Astrological Event for You." She writes in detail about Saturn's qualities, with a focus on the first Saturn return. Also, *Newsweek* (December 21, 2017) published a piece by Callum Paton, "Winter Solstice: Astrologers Say December 21 Will Be Worst Day of the Year," which focuses on the fact that Saturn moved into Capricorn on the same day as the solstice. I'm not so sure that the promise of "the worst day" was realized, but the concept received a great deal of attention in multiple media outlets in print and online.

Meanwhile, this is a clear heads-up for astrologers who are interested in advancing the positive uses and applications of this powerful tool. Perhaps it's time for astrologers to reach out and offer our insights, as they connect to the experiences of life, to media outlets that may not have been particularly friendly to astrology in the past. Not to re-invent the wheel, but we just might let it carry us into expanded territory.

More importantly, if you intend to study astrology for many years, then make sure that the program you get either has all of the features you anticipate needing for a long time, or can export its chart files to other programs (and import from other programs), because you don't want to have to enter every chart into a new program from scratch.

Most astrologers want "room to grow" with their software — that is, the ability to explore new schools of astrology and new techniques as they become more fluent in astrology.
